The Vinjeru School Trust exists to construct and operate a new secondary school with a clear Christian ethos in the town of Kapiri Mposhi in Zambia. The first phase opened in January 2014 with the next one following in January 2015.



he district is one of the fastest arowina towns in Zambia vet has always been viewed as something of a transit town and therefore has little infrastructure and development.

Many children in Kapiri attend government primary schools up to the age of 13 and then have to stop school or go to a government secondary school. These secondary schools are far away from Kapiri Mposhi and are operating well above capacity, some with classes between 65 and 100 children and only one teacher.

According to the Ministry of Education in Zambia, the district needs 35 new secondary schools to cater for the number of children currently living in the area. The Vinjeru School Trust will be one such secondary school with a projected capacity of 600 students.

The effect that educated students have on the wider community is very significant. As they move into employment or further education, ex-students of Vinjeru School will be able to help their families

and will break the cycle of poverty in which so many of them are caught. The school will also provide much needed jobs for the local community, both during construction and now that the school is open.



In each of phases one and two we had an initial intake of 50 students. Then in each of the following years we will aim to take in at least two forms as we continue to construct the school until it reaches full capacity.

A local labour force has been employed to undertake the building project and we are already making an impact on the local community.



We are building the school using Hydraform blocks made of mud and concrete mix. This allows for the rapid building of the school once the foundations for each block has been laid.



'Vinieru' means 'Wisdom' or 'Intelligence' in one of the local languages of the district
